## City Council Regular Meeting November 6, 2023

A City Council regular meeting was held on the above date at Cameron City Hall, McLane Municipal Center, 100 South Houston Avenue, 3<sup>rd</sup> Floor, Cameron, Texas with all officers and members present except Council Member Pratt.

Mayor Harris called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m.

Council Member Deal offered the invocation.

Council Member Dominguez led the pledge of allegiance.

Mayor Harris asked for citizen's comments.

There were no citizens comments.

Council Member Fuchs moved to approve the minutes of the October 16, 2023 regular meeting. Council Member Deal seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

Code Enforcement Officer Ricky McCall stated that information was still not submitted for 915 South Nolan Avenue and recommended denying the permit.

Council Member Fuchs moved to deny the special use permit at 915 South Nolan Avenue. Council Member Cryer seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

Melanie Reed, representing the Cameron Chamber of Commerce, requested the use of the downtown square and surrounding areas for the following events. Parade routes were also submitted.

Council Member Fuchs moved to approve both requests. Council Member Deal seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

City Manager Ricky Tow presented the first amendment to the water tower lease agreement with Verizon Wireless.

Council Member Fuchs moved to approve the amendment as presented. Council Member Cryer seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

Cameron Economic Development Director Ginger Watkins presented and reviewed the CEDC Annual Report.

Council Member Deal moved to approve the report. Council Member Dominguez seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

Council Member Fuchs moved to approve the expenditures for October 14, 2023 through November 3, <u>2023</u>. Council Member Cryer seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.
