## City Council Regular Meeting December 4, 2023

A City Council regular meeting was held on the above date at Cameron City Hall, McLane Municipal Center, 100 South Houston Avenue, 3<sup>rd</sup> Floor, Cameron, Texas with all officers and members present except Council Member Dominguez.

Mayor Harris called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m.

Mayor Harris offered the invocation.

Council Member Cryer led the pledge of allegiance.

Mayor Harris asked for citizen's comments.

Mayor Harris thanked Sharon and Terry Holt for the animal shelter donations.

Virgie Hardeman spoke regarding concerns on street work planned and the disparity of the streets on the West side of Cameron.

There were no other citizens comments.

Mr. Stubbs representing the Killeen Rough Riders requested use of Wilson Ledbetter Park for the Roughriders Annual Trail Ride on October 16-20, 2024.

Council Member Deal moved to approve the request. Council Member Cryer seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

Mr. Stubbs presented a plaques to the Street Department, Police Department and the City of Cameron. Mr. Stubbs then presented the city with a \$700 donation for use of the park and ten \$25 gift cards for residents in need. The City usually relies on Feeders of the Lamb to determine families in need for the gift cards.

Nancy with SPI Engineering presented elevations regarding drainage along the railroad from West 12<sup>th</sup> Street to Highway 36.
