WHEREAS, the City of Cameron recognizes the threat that natural hazards pose to people and property within the City of Cameron; and

WHEREAS, the County of Milam has prepared a multi-hazard mitigation plan, hereby known as Milam County 2025 Hazard Mitigation Action Plan, in accordance with the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000; and

WHEREAS, the Milam County Hazard 2025 Mitigation Action Plan, identifies mitigation goals and actions to reduce or eliminate long-term risk to people and property in the City of Cameron from the impacts of future hazards and disasters; and

WHEREAS, adoption by the City Council demonstrates their commitment to hazard mitigation and achieving the goals outlined in the Milam County 2025 Hazard Mitigation Action Plan.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY OF CAMERON, TEXAS, THAT:

The City Council adopts the Milam County 2025 Hazard Mitigation Action Plan. This plan, approved by the community, may be edited or amended after submission for review, but will not require the community to re-adopt any further iterations. This only applies to this specific plan and does not absolve the community from updating the plan in 5 years.
