City Council Regular Meeting May 19, 2025

A City Council regular meeting was held on the above date at Cameron City Hall, McLane Municipal Center, 100 South Houston Avenue, 3rd Floor, Cameron, Texas with all officers and members present except Council Member Vaculin.

Mayor Fuchs called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m.

Council Member Deal offered the invocation.

Sophia White would like to place a HUD code manufactured home one her property for her son to live in.

Code Enforcement Officer Aaron Odom stated that the Planning and Zoning Commission recommended denial due to all houses in area being stick built.
